'Twas the night before Christmas, he lived all alone, in a one bedroom house made of plaster and stone. I had come down the chimney with presents to give and to see just who in this home did live. I looked all about a strange sight I did see, no tinsel, no presents, not even a tree. No stocking by the fire, just boots filled with sand, on the wall hung pictures of far distant lands.

With medals and badges, awards of all kind a sober thought came through my mind. For this house was different, so dark and dreary, I knew I had found the home of a soldier, once I could see clearly. I heard stories about them; I had to see more so I walked down the hall and pushed open the door. And there he lay sleeping, silent, alone, curled up on the floor in his one bedroom home.

I watched him for hours, so silent and still, I noticed he shivered from the cold night's chill.

So I took off my jacket, the one made of red, and I covered this Soldier from his toes to his head. And I put on his T-shirt of gray and black, with an eagle and an Army patch embroidered on back. And although it barely fit me, I began to swell with pride, and for a shining moment, I was United States Army deep inside. I didn't want to leave him on that cold dark night, this guardian of honor so willing to fight.

Then the soldier rolled over, whispered with a voice so clean and pure, "Carry on Santa, it's Christmas Day, all is secure." One look at my watch, and I knew he was right, Merry Christmas my friend, and to all a good night!

The soldier awakened and I heard a rough voice, "Santa don't cry, this life is my choice; I fight for freedom, I don't ask for more, my life is my God, my country, my Corps."

With that he rolled even and drifted off to clean I.

With that he rolled over and drifted off to sleep, I couldn't control it, I continued to weep.
