Some people have told me that during Vietnam, some American Legion Posts did not welcome Vietnam veterans. We must make sure that we welcome America's newest Veterans. and all Veterans. We have a couple new members so if you see someone you don't recognize at coffee or breakfast, be sure to say hi and welcome them to Post 313.

SUPPORTING OUR TROOPS WHEREVER THEY

ARE. The Vietnam War was one of America's longest wars, but the continuing conflicts in Iraq, Afghanistan and other parts of the Middle East have now been going on for longer. We continue to support our troops overseas, with 8 boxes going down range to Iraq, Afghanistan, and Korea. We also sent two boxes each to a member's nephew and to a Post 313 member in Qatar.

One of the consequences of our train, advise and assist strategy in these countries is that American advisers are sometimes sent to small, distant outposts that have little in the way of services or PX supplies. Member Tom Allen also has contributed pillow cases, which appear to be in demand among troops. So when we send baby wipes, granola bars, and drink mix, it is highly appreciated, as we appreciated such care packages in the past.

PREPAREDNESS, LOCAL AND NATIONAL. As your commander, I have often mentioned in these notes the need for emergency preparedness. Marin County recently held two community meetings about

wildfire preparedness. Two important points to remember about this subject are: Know your evacuation routes, and keep an open defensible space around your house. And as my nephew from Santa Rosa who was evacuated twice told me, know what is essential to take with you, boxed up or readily available, if you have to leave.

At the national level, the continuing debate about government shutdown, budgets, and funding has had serious consequences for our military. Lack of certainty about defense budgets has led to cuts in training, readiness and modernization. As a result, American Legion National Commander Denise Rohan has suggested we urge our leaders to PasstheBudget. Clear defense spending guidelines will keep our military strong, and our country free.

Remember the heroic acts of four Army chaplains on Feb. 4

Feb. 3 will mark the 75th anniversary of the sinking of the United States Army Transport Dorchester and the selfless acts of four Army chaplains who were aboard. American Legion posts nation-

wide are encouraged to commemorate the anniversary each February and honor Four Chaplains Day. The Dorchester tragically sunk on Feb. 3, 1943, while crossing the North Atlantic, transporting troops to an American base in Greenland. A German U-boat fired a torpedo that struck the Dorchester, killing 672 of the 902 officers and enlisted men, merchant seamen and civilian workers aboard.

Many of those survivors owe their lives to the courage and leadership exhibited by four chaplains of different faiths, who, in sacrificing their lives, created a unique legacy of brotherhood.
